



Intellectual Property Rights Agreement

DNA Volunteer

As a DNA Volunteer, such as a member of the Board of Directors, Committee, Task Force, Advisory Council, or any other assigned role within the DNA, you understand that any content produced in your volunteer role is and will remain the intellectual property of the DNA.

Intellectual Property

Intellectual property is developed by utilizing volunteer creativity and innovation. Some of this material may be copyrighted or trademarked and is protected by law. Any material produced within the DNA can only be used for purposes specified by the DNA. A license contract granting permission to use the intellectual property has to be granted by the DNA for any other use.

Review and Development

Previously created intellectual property of the DNA may from time-to-time need to be reviewed and revised. Changes may be recommended by the DNA Board, committee members, task forces, advisory councils, DNA staff, and any others appointed to review intellectual property.

Planner Overview

Those involved in the planning of any development of DNA intellectual property should ensure the success of the content developed.

Miscellaneous

- This agreement can only be modified in writing.
- Rights cannot be assigned under this agreement to anyone else.
