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EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

LINDA S. MARKHAM, BSN, RN, DNC

DNA has embarked on a growth strategy. In September 2024 the DNA Board of Directors hired a consultant to perform an evaluation of the organization to assess the current priorities, programs & offerings, member and audience needs, and positioning in the marketplace.

The evaluation was carried out over four phases. Phase one (Discovery & Research) included a review of documents and scheduled interviews to garner a deeper understanding of our annual meeting, membership experience, marketing capabilities, and governance structure to identify where the challenges and opportunities lie. Areas of focus included the annual meeting, membership, marketing and communications, and governance. Stakeholder interviews were conducted with volunteer leadership, members, and non-members. Phase two (Business Model Assessment) was to help identify areas requiring improvement, strategies to better utilize strengths, and opportunities for growth in the future. This included an evaluation of key initiatives of financial performance, value creation, brand positioning, organizational structure and governance, the Nurse Practitioner Society, an environmental scan, and association trends. Phase three (Virtual **Ideation Session)** included identifying a Task Force of DNA Stakeholders that was composed of current leaders as well as representatives from a variety of membership categories and types. Phase 1&2 assessments were shared and a facilitated discussion to tap into the collective knowledge and experience of the group to envision a compelling future for the DNA was held during an ideation session to generate and share potential ideas for DNA growth. Phase four (Growth Strategy Development) included developing a growth strategy and set of recommendations for DNA which will be aspirational, achievable, and designed for practical implementation.

All findings were presented to the Board of Directors including recommended pathways and an ultimate value proposition; the growth strategy exploration with potential pathways; and a roadmap to increase sustainability and revenue with short term (foundational), mid term (expansion), and long term (flourishing) recommendations. The Board of Directors then took time to reflect and digest the findings that were recommended.

Using this new strategy for a framework, it is now time to integrate it into an updated DNA Strategic Plan. In preparation for this, the Board has continued to review the recommendations, pre-strategic plan interviews have been conducted, and the Board of Directors along with other DNA key opinion leaders have scheduled strategic planning sessions to identify and prioritize key goals and activities into 2026-2028. In using the new strategic plan as a framework, an operational plan that details the specific tactics, activities, and initiatives will be developed that the board, committees, and staff will be focused on over the next three years to advance the new plan and strategy. The operational plan will be developed following the strategic planning process to have a refreshed business model, a deeper understanding of audience profiles, enhanced membership strategies, annual meeting improvements, topline marketing strategies, and a refreshed governance.

Our future strategy will assist our members with opportunities and resources for their professional growth. We have already implemented the Grow with DNA campaign which champions collaboration, inclusivity, and empowerment. It invites you to be part of something bigger: a thriving, engaged network that prioritizes your growth, celebrates your achievements, and opens doors to leadership, mentorship, and career development. Together, we grow stronger. Together, we Grow with DNA. DNA looks forward to having you grow along with us into our future.



Dermatology Nursing Essentials A DNA Premiere Core Curriculum Workshop

Course Description

The Dermatology Nursing Essentials Premiere Core Curriculum Workshop has been developed for the new or experienced dermatology healthcare professional (NP, RN, LPN, MA, Office Staff) to help them gain an overall understanding of the body's largest organ, the integumentary system. Anatomy and physiology to common diseases and treatments encountered in dermatology are the focus. This course is also recommended for dermatology nurses who work in specialized dermatology practices, such as surgery or aesthetic dermatology, or who are reviewing for national certification in dermatology nursing, nursing students, and other healthcare professionals interested in dermatology. NURSE PRACTITIONER IN DERMATOLOGY

A nurse practitioner in dermatology is a clinician who offers holistic, high-quality care for their patients. They have advanced clinical training beyond their initial professional registered nurse preparation with a master's or doctoral degree and advanced education and training in the specialty. Many nurse practitioners also achieve dermatology nurse practitioner certification demonstrating a higher degree of professional competence. Nurse practitioners are highly-trained dedicated professionals who are trusted by both patients and other healthcare providers.

Expertise in dermatology is accomplished through specialty training or completion of a post-graduate internship program. In addition, the dermatology nurse practitioner participates in independent continuing education activities such as those offered by professional organizations such as Dermatology Nurses' Association (DNA).

Increasing health care needs are driving the growth of the profession. Nurse practitioners in dermatology provide high-quality comprehensive care for diverse patient populations, increase patient access to healthcare services and decrease wait times to care.

Nurse practitioners in dermatology emphasize the patient-centered holistic approach to dermatology through expert care, comprehensive examination, clear communication and continuity of care.

Responsibilities

- Performs comprehensive examinations of the skin, hair, nails, and mucosa
- Orders and interprets diagnostic tests
- Prescribes medications
- Performs surgical procedures including biopsies and excisions
- Diagnoses and treats dermatologic conditions
- Provides counseling and education
- Works with other health care professionals to provide comprehensive care

Other responsibilities may include:

- Phototherapy treatment
- Cosmetic procedures
- Laser procedures
- Telemedicine
- Policy development
- Dermatologic Research

Criteria for all awards, grants and scholarships include:

All candidates must be a current DNA member for a minimum of two completed consecutive years of membership.

A DNA member may not win the same award two years in a row and may only win one award per year.

All winners will write an article for the Focus Newsletter on what receiving their award has meant to them.

The Awards, Grants and Scholarships application process will be open year round. Deadline for applications to be received and reviewed is October 1st of the year prior to receiving the awards or funds. 


