

On Tuesday, August 12, 2025, the DNA BOD held a virtual meeting.

The meeting, led by Interim President Robin Inabinet, included approval of the consent agenda and review of pending action items, most of which were completed or in progress. Notable decisions included the unanimous approval of Kimberly Madison, DNP, AGCNP-BC, WCC, as a new member of the Education Advisory Council (EAC), and the launch of the Dermatology Nursing Essentials Core Curriculum Workshop, with approved pricing set at \$225 for non-members and \$160 for members.

The Board also agreed to partner with sneakers-4good, a sustainability initiative that provides non-dues revenue and supports global footwear needs, to be implemented at the DNA Convention and on the DNA website. Discussions were held regarding the need for a President-elect for the 2026–2027 term to ensure organizational sustainability, with action items assigned to post potential nominee lists and review past president rosters.

The meeting, led by Interim President Robin Inabinet, began with approval of the consent agenda and a review of pending action items, most of which were marked complete, including updates on marketing, committee appointments, and partnership initiatives. The main focus of the meeting was strategic planning, specifically identifying and updating the organization's key drivers of change, core organizational values, and the definition of engagement. Discussions highlighted the importance of adapting to technological advancements, attracting new members, exploring hybrid conventions, and fostering a culture of integrity, credibility, visionary leadership, and collaboration.

Due to time constraints, the Board agreed to continue brainstorming and sharing ideas on Basecamp, particularly regarding strategic planning and engagement definitions. The meeting concluded with information-only updates on membership statistics, social media, and board evaluations. Several action items remain pending, with all Board members tasked to contribute further input on strategic planning topics via Basecamp.

New Modules on Advocacy and Pediatric Dermatology Research

The Dermatology Nurses' Association (DNA) continues to expand its library of high-quality educational opportunities, introducing two new continuing nursing education (CNE) modules that enhance professional growth and strengthen the impact of dermatology nurses across care settings.

Advocacy (Session #17164), presented by Marilyn Dollinger, DNS, FNP, RN, launched on September 23, 2025. This 75-minute program explores how nurses can serve as powerful advocates for their patients and the nursing profession. Participants learn to differentiate between lobbying and advocacy, navigate the policy process, and develop communication strategies for engaging legislators effectively. Dr. Dollinger also highlights DNA's current national advocacy agenda and provides practical tools for members to get involved. The course reinforces the vital role nurses play in shaping health policy and advancing practice standards through informed, strategic engagement.

It awards 1.25 ANCC NCPD credits and is available for \$15 (members) / \$25 (non-members) through the DNA Education Center.

The second new offering, Advancing Pediatric Dermatology Research: An Overview of PeDRA (Session #17162), launched on September 15, 2025, and is led by Michael Siegel, PhD, Executive Director of the Pediatric Dermatology Research Alliance (PeDRA). This 60-minute program introduces learners to the mission and research activities of PeDRA, emphasizing the importance of collaboration among clinicians, researchers, and families to improve the lives of children with skin diseases and conditions. Participants will gain insight into how nurses and advanced practice providers can actively contribute to pediatric dermatology research and advocacy efforts.

The course awards 1.00 ANCC NCPD credit and is available for \$15 (members) / \$25 (non-members).

DNA's 44th Annual Convention

The focus of the Convention is to provide continuing education to healthcare professionals (nurse practitioners, registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, medical assistants and all other healthcare professionals and staff) who specialize or have an interest in dermatology.

The goals and objectives of the Convention are:

- Meet educational needs through dermatologic educational programs based on feedback from previous conventions, educational needs assessment, evidence-based practice, current guidelines, current therapies, and research.
- Provide workshop opportunities to meet the specific needs of special interest groups.
- Provide an avenue for networking, mentoring, and socializing to enhance professional growth and development of DNA members.
- Promote interest in dermatology-related fields, including safety, ethics, research, clinical testing, publishing, management, and advocacy to advance dermatologic care.

Presentations will focus on several educational tracks to include:

- Professional Development/Research
- Surgical/Cutaneous Oncology
- Medical /Pediatric Dermatology
- Aesthetics
- Pharmacotherapeutics

This year the Convention will be like no other. There will be a variety of oral presentations on acute and chronic skin disorders, dermatology emergencies and updates in treatments presented by experts in the field of dermatology. Rare and challenging cases will be presented with the opportunity for audience input. The Nurse Practitioner Forum will focus on advanced content. There will be "hands-on" activities and sessions with opportunities for participation and panel discussions incorporated throughout the program. We plan to offer a surgical and wound care mini-workshop as well special interest groups. There will be a yoga session for decompressing and relaxing. The convention will conclude with an option to attend the Dermoscopy workshop.






APRIL MITCHELL, BSN, RN, AMB-BC MEMBERSHIP ADVISORY COUNCIL CHAIR


